Big Picture: Does God Exist?

Dr. Roy Fouch is a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor with a PhD. in Psychology. He has worked for over 48 years in the mental health and addiction field and is currently Director of Mental Health Services at the Hamilton County Justice Center in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is also in private practice as a Christian Counselor, specializing in marriage and family counseling. He and his wife have been members of God's church for 45 years.

Dr. Brian Hoselton is a chiropractor, graduated from Ambassador College and has been an elder since 2012 serving Columbia/Fulton, MO.

Andy Lee is an elder in the Cleveland, Ohio congregation, where he lives together with his wife Karen. He has two adult children and a grandchild. Andy was raised in the church and has worked for the past 28 years for a big four public accounting firm, where he's been a partner in the tax practice for the past 18 years.

Marcus Lucas was hired by the Church as a ministerial trainee in March 2022 and has been living in Cincinnati with his wife Lindsay and their two children.

Jacob Mammen is a member of the United Church of God in the Chattanooga, TN congregation.
